2023 marks another strong year of tremendous community work, now our 52nd year for Chinatown Service Center (CSC). As we look back, our Legacy of Service started for the Immigrant families in Chinatown and over time expanded to the general communities in the San Gabriel Valley and beyond Southern California. I am thankful to our community for entrusting in our services; our sponsors and supporters in believing in us; our Staff for delivering for CSC; and of course, the Board of Directors for their guidance to our strategic plans and visions.

This Year, we celebrate "Love, Hope, and Blossom". We are also celebrating the prolific legacies of our two past presidents in Judge Ronald Lew and Bee Hsu. These two leaders have been pillars of the API community which we are blessed to have had them in CSC's rich history of dedicated leaders.

I am pleased to report a few significant milestones of CSC's growth this year: acquisition of our new Administration Building in Chinatown Los Angeles, and renovation commencement of our new Regional Medical Facility in Alhambra. We continue to expand our services reaching over 150,000 annual touch points in our Social Services and Community Health Clinics. This year, we further grew our partnerships with USC Keck School of Medicine, UCLA's East West Medicine, and launched CSC Lending – a Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) who will serve the small businesses in Southern California.

We have grown significantly to serve the needs of our community. Specific to the January 21, 2023 tragedy in Monterey Park, we quickly coordinated with local Government entities as well as API non-profits in creating a Victim's Fund in addition to providing ground level mental health resources. We have expanded this service by partnering with the City of Monterey Park in creating a Resiliency Center at the local Sierra Vista Park Community Center so that there is ongoing mental health counseling.

Thank You to all our supporters, donors, collaborating organizations, Staff, and Board Directors. You are the core that makes CSC strong and with you we will accomplish even more into the future. I wish all of you and your families the best!







History of Chinatown Service Center



In the past few decades, Chinatown - a community close to the Los Angeles Business District - became the home to many newly arrived immigrants, refugees, and their families. Most of these immigrants were low income families with little to no literacy in English. Being linguistically isolated, these families did notknow how or where to get resources to help them achieve a better living situation. In order to meet the needs of these families and other immigrants coming into Los Angeles, Chinatown Service Center was established.

Chinatown Service Center (CSC) was founded in 1971, when the Pastor of the Chinese United Methodist Church started an outreach program to provide bilingual services to Chinese immigrants. The Church provided an office space for one paid bilingual staff along with several volunteers to help the newly-arrived immigrants adjust culturally to their new surroundings. In 1975, with the assistance of Judge Ronald Lew and other community leaders, CSC was incorporated as a non-profit organization dedicated solely to serving the community.

During that same year, with the assistance and support from the Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association, CSC received its first government grant from the City of Los Angeles to operate an employment service program for the community. Poy Wong - one of the chairs from the Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association- and its members continued their efforts to assist CSC in receiving government grants. As a result of the hard work and support from different individuals as well as the community, CSC was able to receive more grants from the government. In return, CSC continued to expand due to the high demand of services sought after by the immigrants. In 1985, CSC moved to the ground floor of the newly built Cathay Manor, a housing project designed to accommodate elderly immigrants. After four years at Cathay Manor; however, CSC needed to increase its space due to expansion. And so in 1991, CSC established its second (and present) office in Alpine Towers Plaza. In 1998, CSC did away with having separate offices in Los Angeles and moved all its services and offices under one roof at Alpine Towers Plaza. CSC continued to expand; in 1992, CSC opened a satellite office in the City of Monterey Park to provide services for the residents of the West San Gabriel Valley.



History of Chinatown Service Center

In addition to services for residents, there was also a great need to have services provided to the youth in the community. As a result, CSC's Youth Center opened its doors in 2001. A 2nd Medical Clinic was opened in 2010 in the City of Alhambra. In 2015, a 2nd Dental Clinic was opened in the City of Monterey Park and a 3rd Dental Clinic was opened with the Behavioral Health Division in the City of Alhambra in 2016. Another new Medical and Dental Clinic has opened to serve the San Gabriel communities in 2017. In 2018, we opened an Optometry Department at our main clinic site on Hill Street in Chinatown. In 2019, CSC added specialties services, Chiropractic, Gl., and Podiatry. On May 1st, 2020, CSC was awarded a grant and the US HHS designation of "Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic" (CCBHC). We added Suite #206 at the Alhambra BH Clinic to facilitate the need. In November, CSC expanded the Alhambra Medical Clinic in adding the adjacent suite #106. CSC also acquired a new mobile unit to visit school and housing sites. In 2021, CSC was recognized on the Achievement of Recognition for Patient-Centered Medical Home (PCMH) in providing patients a care delivery model where patient treatment is coordinated through their family doctor to ensure they receive the necessary care when and where they need it, in a manner they can understand. CSC programs are also partnered with schools, churches, and other organizations with staff stationed on-site.

Today, CSC is the largest community-based Chinese-American health and human service organization in Southern California. CSC provides a comprehensive range of services, organized under eight service categories: Social Services, Behavioral Health, Medical Services, Dental Services, the Small Business Program, the Youth Center, the Child Development Center, and In-home Senior Care Services. Services are available in a variety of dialects, including (but not limited to): Cantonese, Mandarin, Toisan, Chiu Jou, Vietnamese, Spanish, and Khmer (Cambodian).

CSC was also involved in disaster situations such as the 1992 Los Angeles Riot and the 1994 Northridge earthquake. CSC together with the former chairs of the Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association, Mr. Chan and Mr. Chiu, banks, other organizations, and volunteers to provide services to the victims such as distributing food, assisted them to apply benefits that were available to them and personal needs. CSC was under the seven Executive Directors during the 50 years of services, Joyce Law, Irene Chu, Debbie Ching, Diane Poon, Lawrence Lue, Karen Blakeney, and our present Chief Executive Officer, Peter Ng.



Lung Kong Ming Yee Hing Association

Lung Kong Tin Yee Association of Los Angeles has served the L.A. Chinese immigrant community since about 1949, impacting the lives of countless generations of Chinese families trying to make their way here in America. Not only is Lung Kong represented by the Liu, Guan, Zhang, and Zhao surnames, but it has also broadly welcomed all families and contributed to the Chinese community overall. Lung Kong's Ming Yee Hing Lion Dance Group carries on the traditions of lion dance representing historical ancestors that embody the foundation of Lung Kong. The yellow lion represents Liu Bei, red lion represents Guan Yu, black lion represents Zhang Fei, and the colorful lion represents Zhao Yun. These 4 sworn brothers were also the famed tiger generals in the Three Kingdoms history of China, and whose principles are still honored by Lung Kong today.



Field Trips

Background

Since its establishment in 2000, the CSC Youth Center has been a vital sanctuary for young individuals aged 11 to 21. However, as of 2022, we have expanded our services to accommodate a broader age range, now catering to youths aged 5 to 21. Our youth center warmly welcomes students from elementary, middle, and high schools, offering a safe haven and a supportive environment during after-school hours from 2:30pm to 6pm. Here, they can seek refuge, receive academic support, gain assistance with post-secondary education and work readiness, and even find guidance for summer internships.



Financial Literacy Workshop

This year, we have extended our workshops to the youths in the San Gabriel Valley. We organized a series of college-readiness and financial literacy workshops, which took place at the Monterey Park Bruggemeyer Library.

In addition to our existing work-readiness programs, we have introduced a paid internship program for high school youths aged 14-18. This program offers valuable work experience and enables participants to enhance their professional skills.
